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Introduction

The Colorful Ukulele is a simple and straight forward method for young children.

The student will learn the basic strumming, chord positions and music notation, through the use of colors on the Ukulele fingerboard, making it easy to find the correct frets, and be able to play simple chords and music notes, without any prior music knowledge.

Once the first four chords are learnt, the student will learn how to sing nine very well known children songs. The second part of this book, is dedicated to learn the music notes, playing melodies combining single notes and chords.

The instrument used with this method and book need to be adapted adding the colors patterns on the fingerboard (with full diagram and examples within to convert your own!)

This book included 31 audio tracks that accompany the lessons. They feature full demonstrations of the exercises and songs the student will learn. The stickers sheet with the colors pattern for the Ukulele fingerboard is included in the book. (*Follow the instructions*)

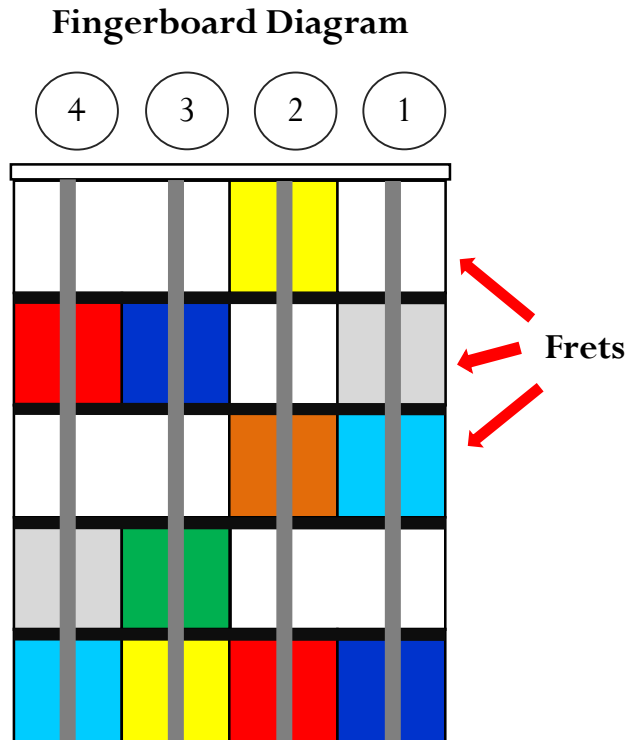

Here is the fingerboard diagram and the picture as the example.

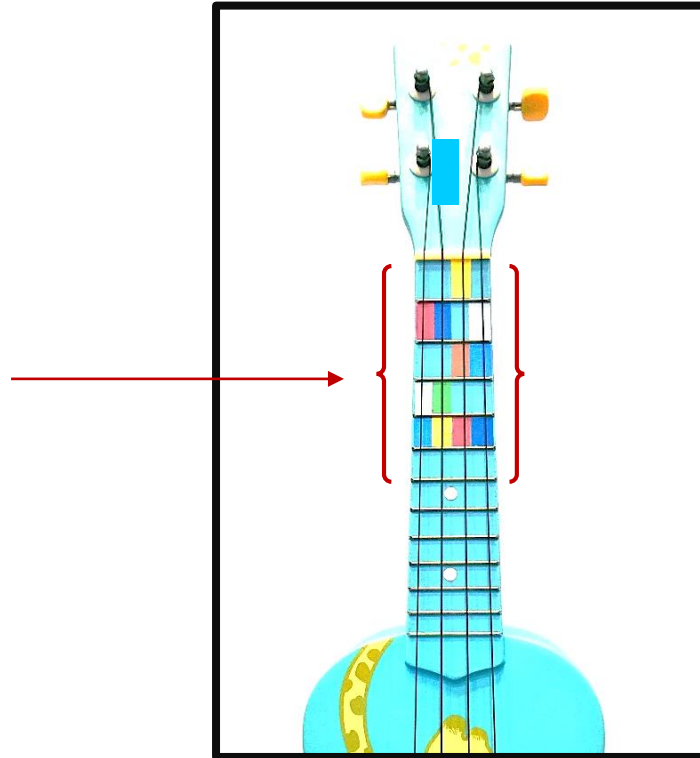
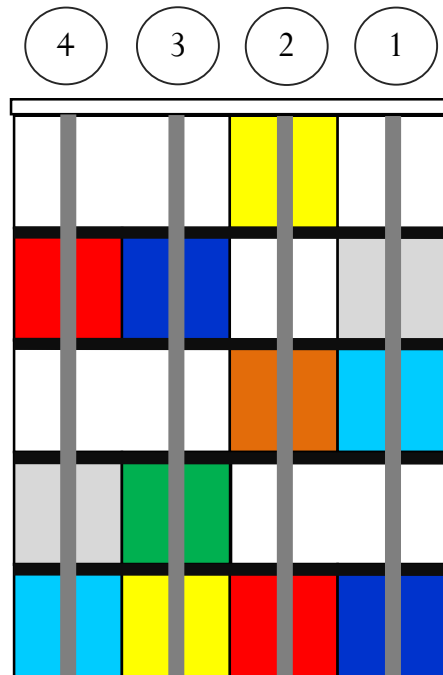
In the last page of this book you will find the colors charts in a stickers sheet to cut and pate on the ukulele fingerboard, as showing in the picture next page.

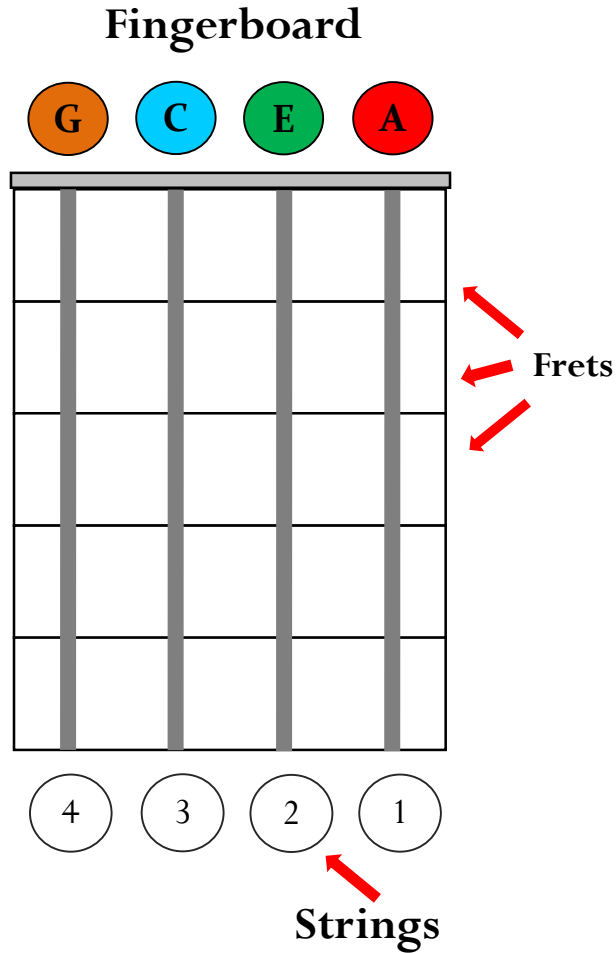

Strings and Tuning



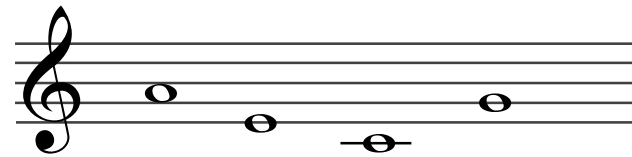
Ukulele Strings:

The Ukulele has four strings, and we count them from the bottom string to the top.

Standard Tuning

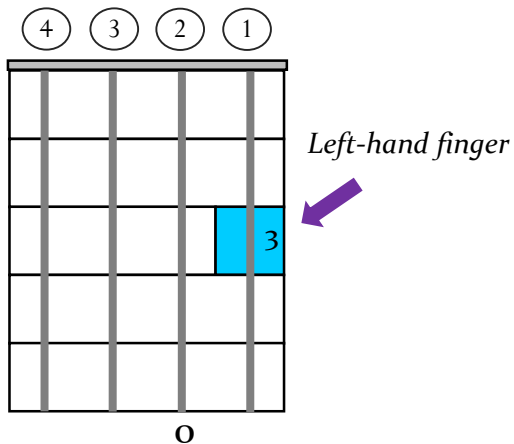
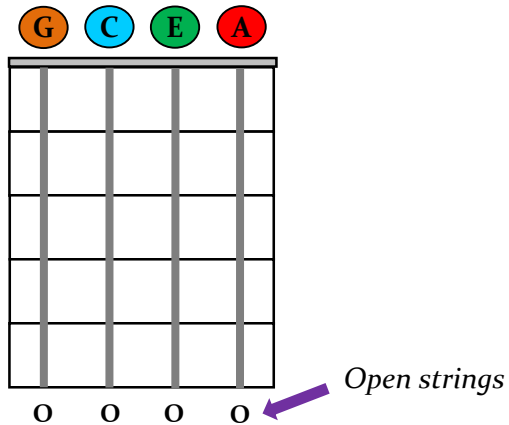
The first string is **A**, second is **E**, third **C**, and fourth is **G**

Pitches: **A** **E** **C** **G**



Strings: first second third fourth

Open Strings & Fingers



Open strings

Open strings are the strings played only with the right-hand fingers, without using the left hand on the fingerboard.

The sign for **Open String** is the number: 0

The **Left-Hand** fingers are numbers: 1 2 3 4

The **Right-Hand** fingers are named: T, i and m

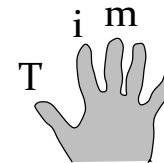
An other way to play the Ukulele is using a **Pick**, holding it between the thumb and index finger of the **right-hand**, which some students may find easier

Strumming Open Strings

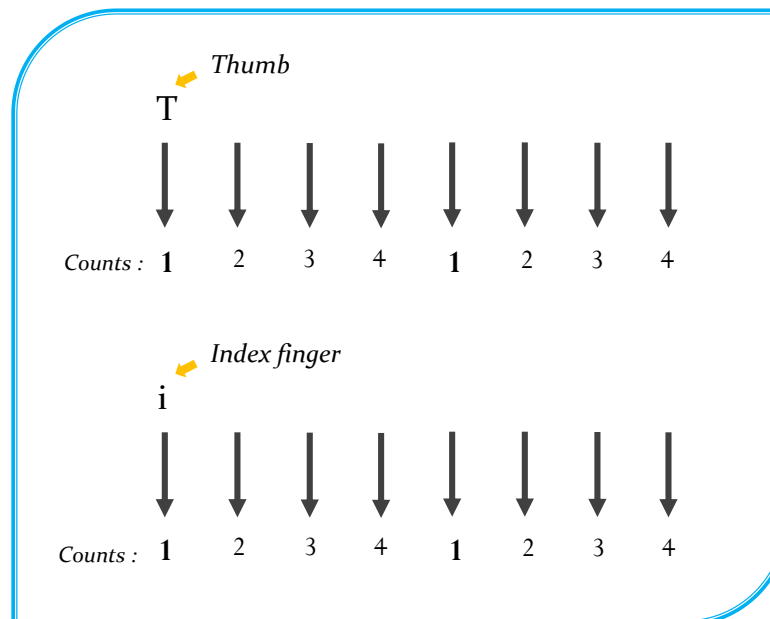
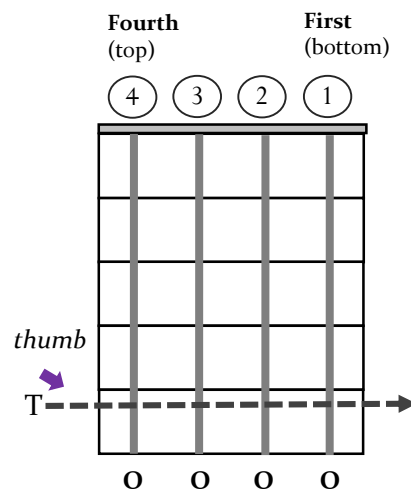

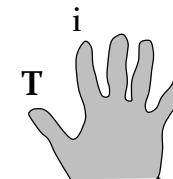
Strum from the string (4) down ↓ to the string (1) with your right hand Thumb (T).

You can repeat the strumming with the finger index (i), moving the finger downward with the nail side. Alternatively, the student could use a Pick for the strumming, if it is more comfortable.

(Strum the strings in a regular pulse.)

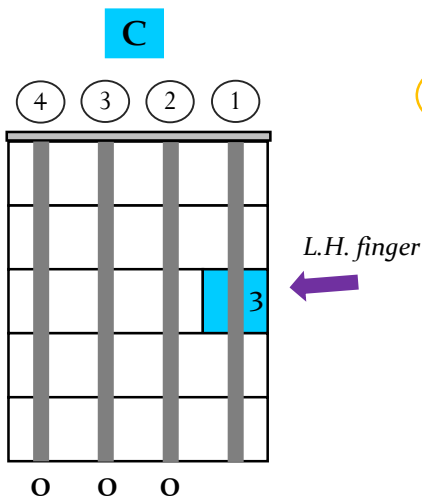

The **C** Chord

Press the first string with your finger **3** of the left-hand on the **Blue** fret.
Strum from the fourth to the first string with the thumb: **(T)** (*right-hand*)
Alternatively strumming with index (i) or a Pick.

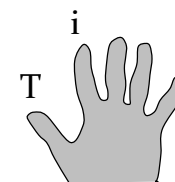

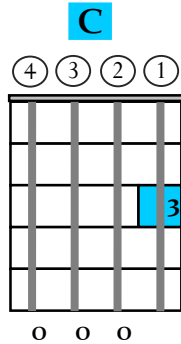

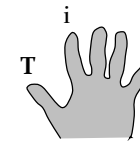

Sing the song and strum the strings with the **C** chord to a regular pulse. Strum the strings with the thumb or index finger of your Right-Hand (T or i) from the top string ④ DOWN to the bottom string ①.

(Alternatively strumming with a Pick.)

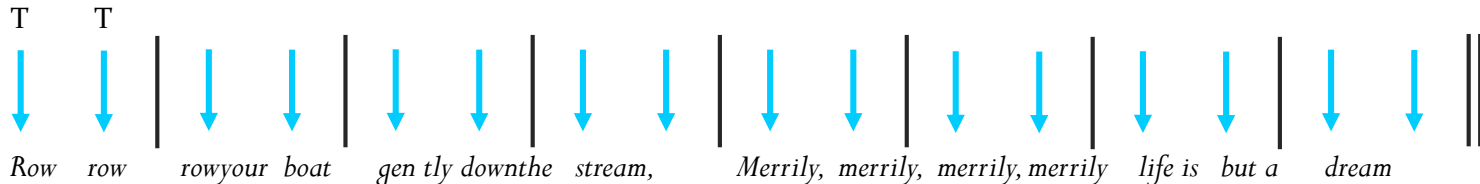

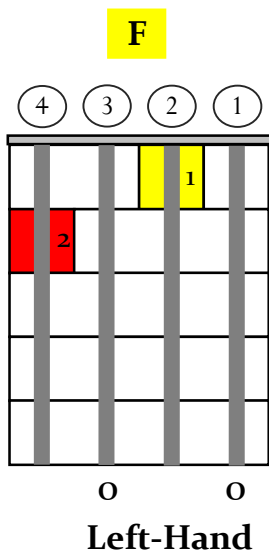

Press the fourth string with your finger **2** on the **Red** fret. Press the second string with the finger **1** on the **Yellow** fret.

Strum from the top string to the bottom string with your thumb (**T**).
Alternatively strumming with index (**i**) or a **Pick**.

(Strum the strings in a regular pulse.)

Strum the strings from the top to the bottom sting with your thumb (T) or index (i) Right-Hand. Alternatively strumming with a Pick.



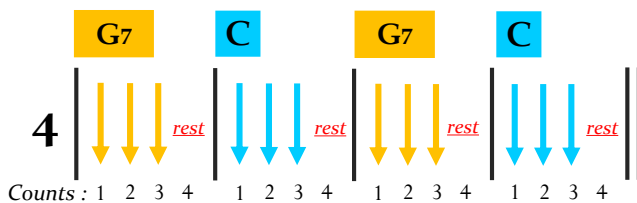
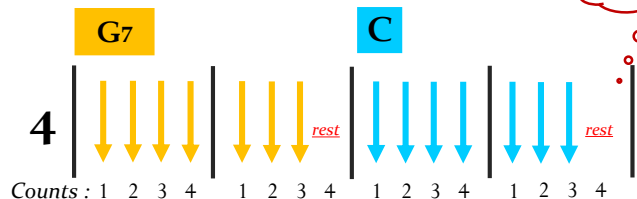

Press the third string on the **Blue** fret with your finger **1**. Press the second string with finger **3** on the **Orange** fret, use your finger 2 for the first string on the **Grey** fret.

Strum the strings from the top string to the bottom with your thumb (T) or index (i). Alternatively strumming with a Pick.

(Strum the strings in a regular pulse.)

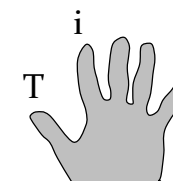
